### Chords needed

This song needs a fair number of chords! Here's how I personally prefer to play them. Note, for the intro & chorus chords – I do *not* play the notes you see within the parentheses. You can play these if you want, but know it'll make the transitions and integration of the riff a bit tougher to pull off. See my video lesson for reference.

### Chord progressions, at a glance

To get an idea of the structure of this song, see the progressions below. Note how the intro and chorus use the same progression. The verse uses a unique progression of its own.

#### Intro & chorus:

### Practicing the riff w/ bass notes only

If you're just getting started with the intro riff, this is a great way to get started (i.e., only worry about the bass notes).

### Transitioning from the intro/chorus into the verse

Just before starting each verse, you'll end the intro/chorus chords the following way (going from Am => C).
